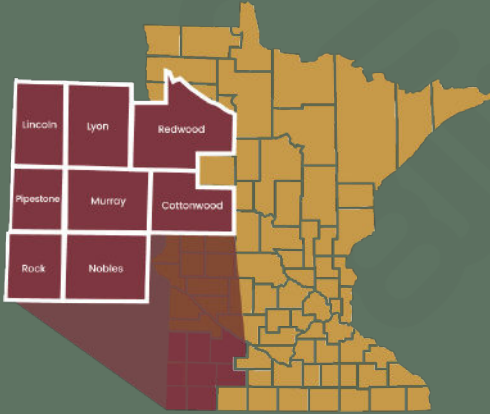

3,293 volunteers delivered 344,570 hours of service across 399 active stations, an impact equivalent to more than 165 full-time employees. Notably, 137 volunteers served in multiple counties and 1,543 served at two or more stations.

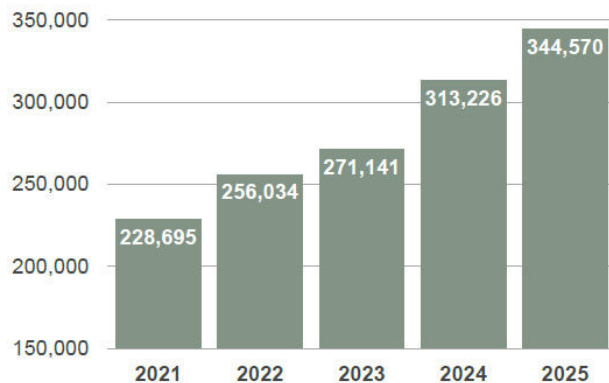
The 2025 cumulative cost of volunteer service for all A.C.E. volunteers was \$2.06/hour.

The task of putting a dollar value on volunteer time is a difficult one, because volunteers provide so many intangibles that cannot be easily quantified. Even so, the Bureau of Labor Statistics compiles yearly earnings data that is indexed by Independent Sector - a leadership network for nonprofits, foundations, and corporations - to generate a national rate for volunteer time as well as individual rates for each state. The National value of volunteer time in 2025 was **\$36.14/hour** and the Minnesota value of volunteer time in 2025 was **\$39.80/hour**. These estimates help quantify the enormous value of the services that volunteers provide.

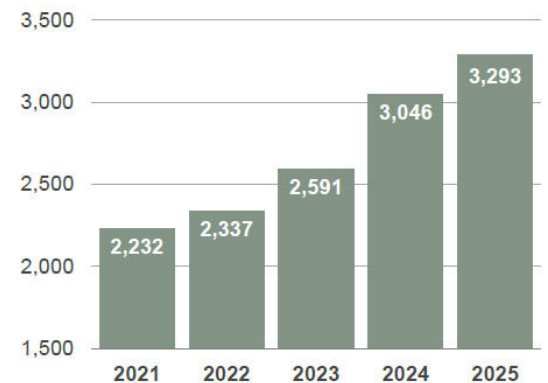
Using the **2025 National value** of Volunteer Time (**\$36.14/hour**), A.C.E. of Southwest Minnesota volunteers donated **\$12,452,759** of service in 2025.

Using the **2025 Minnesota value** of Volunteer Time (**\$39.80/hour**), A.C.E. of Southwest Minnesota volunteers donated **\$13,713,866** of service in 2025.

**AmeriCorps Seniors RSVP Grant - 2025 Primary Objectives and Outcome Projections**

1.	<b>Access to Care - Evidence Based Health Promotion Programs</b> 25 volunteers will serve 300 people, and help 225 people obtain increased health knowledge.
2.	<b>Aging in Place - Companionship Programs and Services (Respite and Sr Dining programs)</b> 175 volunteers will serve 166 people, and help 85 people improve their capacity for independent living through Respite and Sr Dining services.
3.	<b>Obesity and Food - Nutrition and Food Support Programs (Backback School Programs, Commodity Supplemental Food Program [formerly known as NAPS], Food Shelves, MOW programs)</b> 550 volunteers will serve 4,800 people and provide 450 individuals with increased food security through the CSFP program and at Food Shelves/Pantries.
4.	<b>Financial Literacy - Tax Preparation Assistance/Services</b> 10 volunteers will assist 1,400 people with their income taxes, generating \$900,000 in refunds.
5.	<b>Veterans &amp; Families Served - Transportation Service through Nobles Co. DAV van/shuttle</b> 6 volunteers will assist 15 veterans, and provide 11 veterans with improved access to medical care.
6.	<b>Other - Donations Management - Red Cross/Bloodmobile and Thrift Stores</b> 260 volunteers will assist at 15 volunteer sites, and provide 12 volunteer sites with increased effectiveness, efficiency, and/or program scale/reach.
7.	<b>Other Community Priorities - All volunteer work not aligned with another Primary Objective</b> 1,145 volunteers will serve at 199 volunteer stations.

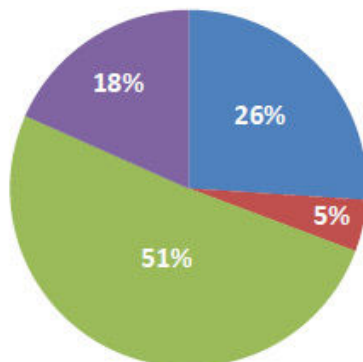

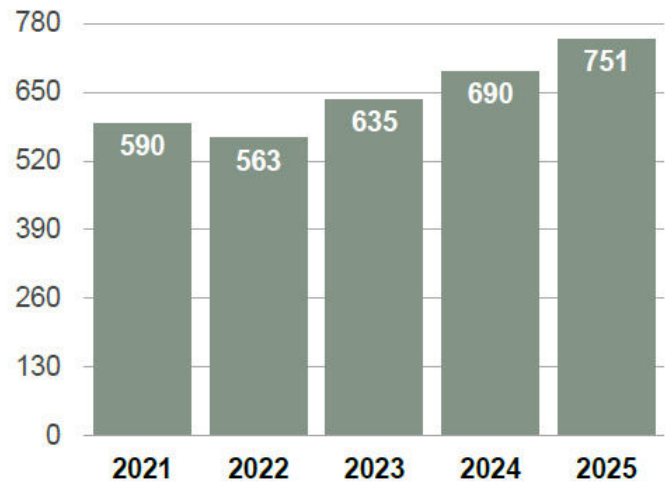
